

PATHWAYS

- Know your interests, skills and goals

- Grade 12- **Five Pathways: College, University, World of Work, Apprenticeship, Community Living**
- Consider a combination of pathways

- **U courses-** University (6 Gr 12) or College
- **M courses-** U and C * some limits
- **C courses-** College or Apprenticeship or W of W
- **E courses-** Workplace or very limited Foundation programs at College

Liaison Visits & Fairs

- Grade 12 for **Liaison Visits**. This sheet must be returned prior to the day of the first presentation.
- If you are a UNIVERSITY BOUND student you can attend **4 university presentations**. You must have taken or be taking at least 6 gr. 12 U or M courses.
- If you are a COLLEGE BOUND student you can attend **4 college presentations**. COLLEGE students CANNOT attend University presentations.

Type of Designation	Certificate, diploma, applied degrees	Degree- undergraduate General and Honors	Certification of apprenticeship, Journeyman, Certificate of Qualification exam
Cost	Away from home \$11,000 - \$15,000 per year	\$17,000 plus per year	Employer pays you usually start at 40%- 60% depending on the trade, gov't helps to pay schooling and you cover the rest (varies)
Studies	Preparation for a particular career	University is studying a subject area (not a skill set)	Trade

Admission Requirements	Required and recommended courses; do not normally give overall averages unless it is highly competitive HOAE-Mrs. Pinelli	Required and recommended courses, overall average based on six best 4U or 4M credits including required courses	Should take a gr 12 math and gr 12 science , some cases employment in the trade
Programming	In college each term of study the courses are normally chosen for you	In university you choose your courses and your timetable based on your particular degree requirements.	Apprenticeships- hours on the job and some time in the classroom



Timelines

- ◎ **College- due date** is normally **Feb 1st** apply to **5 colleges for \$95**
- ◎ **University** the second week of January normally second week of **January**; apply to **3 universities for \$150** and every additional choice is \$50 each, every change on application you will incur an additional charge


SUGGESTIONS- College Requirements

- Each college may have slightly different requirements for similar programs **(Do Your Research)**
- **Required** courses and **Recommended** courses
- **Additional admission** requirements: audition, portfolio, attending an information session, writing an aptitude test, Health Sciences you may have to write HOAE



SUGGESTIONS- University Requirements

- Most universities have similar admissions for **required** courses but may **differ on recommended** courses
- SHOULD take recommended courses
- Additional admission requirements

Next steps

- Consider interests, abilities, values and personality

- Start an educational file (portfolio) at home – include letters of reference from teachers, employers, certificates, report cards, samples of work, resume awards, community hours involvement sheets, auditions...
