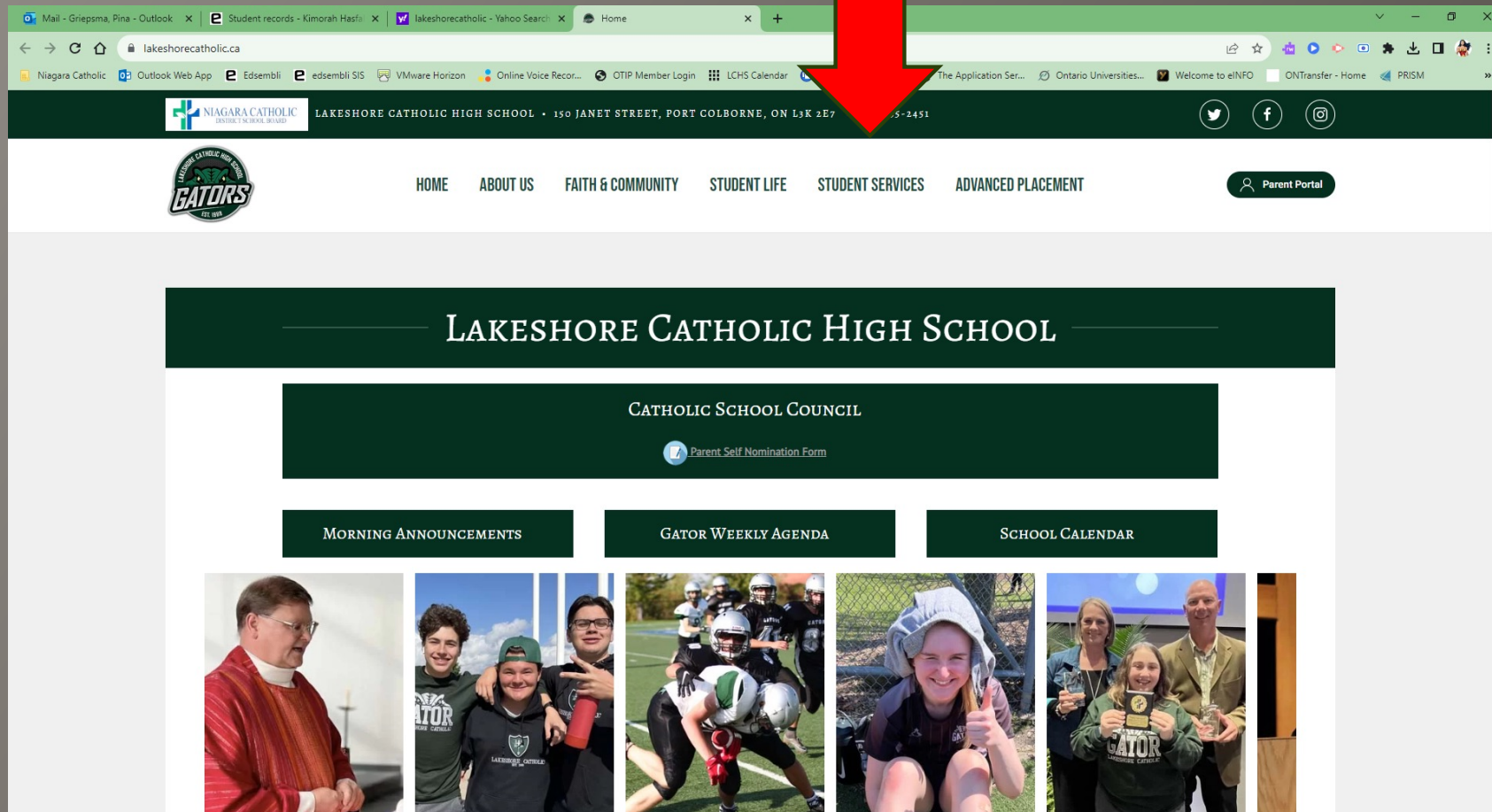



Welcome to Lakeshore Catholic's Student Services Department where our motto is: **"Your Path, Your Future, Our Guidance"**.

The Student Services Department at LCHS is a key component of the secondary school program. Through the Student Services department, students will acquire the knowledge and skills that they need in order to learn effectively, to live and work co-operatively and productively with a wide range of people, to set and pursue education and career goals, and to carry out their social responsibilities. The Student Services department delivers this program through various means; including classroom visits, individual counselling, transition activities, orientation and exit programs, post-secondary exploration activities, career exploration and academic support through tutoring.

It is important for you to become familiar with the role of your guidance counselor. Guidance Counselors provide:

- Academic Counselling - course selection and planning, post-secondary program planning and requirements
- Career Counselling - information on the career development process, career search and course planning
- Personal Counselling - personal counselling referrals are made to Student Services Staff or outside agencies when appropriate
- Attendance Counselling - referrals from teachers, parents and school administration

Supplemental Program Fees

- Supplemental program fees cover the cost of individual faculty admission processes. The supplemental program fee is **non-refundable** and you pay it along **with your OUAC application fee** (last year's fees)

Examples:

- McMaster University – Engineering \$50
- OCAD University – All \$25
- University of Toronto – Architecture \$45
- University of Toronto – Commerce \$50
- University of Toronto, Faculty of Arts & Science – Computer Science \$50
- University of Toronto – Engineering \$40
- University of Waterloo – Accounting \$53.25
- University of Waterloo – Engineering \$53.25

Health Occupations Aptitude Exam (HOAE) Results

Is a standardized pre-admission test for certain health and medical programs at Ontario colleges. Contact your college choice(s) directly to find out if the HOAE is a requirement. After completed and passed the HOAE, the examining college will automatically forward your results to ontariocolleges.ca. Once received, we will post them under Docs or Supporting Documents on the Dashboard and send them to your college choice(s) within 1 to 2 business days.

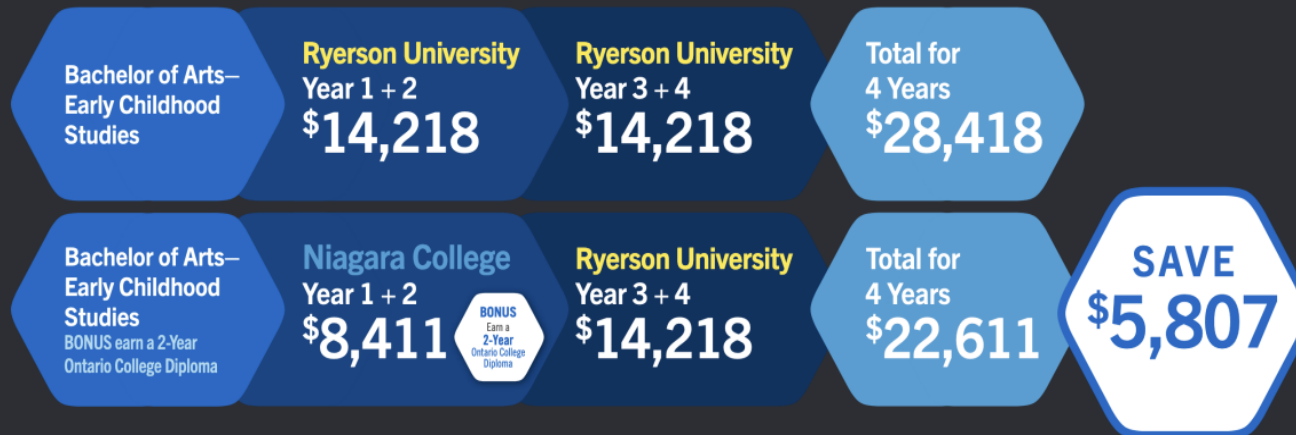

Steps to Becoming an Apprentice

STEP #1

Choose a trade by doing your research.

STEP #3

In Co-op you will become a participant in OYAP (Ontario Youth Apprenticeship Program). This is Part One.

STEP #5

Once OYAP Part Two is completed the Registered Training Agreement is created and signed by the apprentice and sponsor.

STEP #7

The Ministry will ask you your Employment status: Is your Co-op employer going to remain your sponsor?

STEP#2

Take Co-op in grade 11, 12 or 12b for a designated trade.

STEP #4

Once excelling at placement you can become a registrant in OYAP. This is Part Two. The employer must agree.

STEP#6

Upon Graduation contact the Employment and Training Consultant at the MLTSD office to submit your diploma or transcript, Social insurance number & Driver's license.

STEP#8

If your Co-op employer is not going to keep you: find a new sponsor. At this point you will be registered with the Ministry so if a spot becomes available in school it will be offered to you.



Timeline – Transmissions

Date	Transmission
October/November	First data transmission to OCAS and OUAC – consists of biographical information
Late November	Transmission of Sem 1 midterm marks to OCAS and OUAC
February (second week)	Transmission – Sem 1 final marks OCAS and OUAC
Late April- Early May	Transmission – Sem 2 midterm marks to both OCAS and OUAC
July	Transmission – Sem 2 final marks to both OCAS and OUAC
August	Students responsible to send any summer school marks



Timeline – Important Dates

February 1	<p>OCAS application deadline ; fee For 2024-2025 applications, the fee will be updated from \$125 to \$150. 5 choices ONLY</p>
May 1	<p>Deadline for applicants to confirm offers to OCAS; some may be earlier</p>
May 29	<p>Deadline OUAC applicants to receive a response</p>
June 2	<p>Respond to your acceptance at OUAC and may need a financial commitment</p>
June 1	<p>Financial commitment for OCAS \$500</p>



Offers of Admission

- Changing an accepted offer
- Refused admission you can add new choices or delete and add new choices or use **Admission Information Service hotline (with at least a 60% averages)**

- **Ontario colleges** –open, waitlisted or closed

Deferring Your Entry

- Some universities permit you to defer your entry for 1 semester or 1 year. Consult with the university's admission office. May be a cost involved.



OCAS/OUAC Application

- You will need to visit Guidance for your **OEN number-for colleges**
- E-mail addresses (know your password) and know your password
- Apply before Christmas
- **Set up your accounts at each school you apply to**



OCAS/OUAC Application

- **5 college choices RANK THEM** For 2024-2025 applications, the fee will be updated from \$125 to \$150.
- **3 University choices \$156** each additional choice is a separate fee of \$50 may be supplementary fees
- Note:
 - You may apply to as many Ontario universities as you wish; however, you are limited to a maximum of 3 program choices at any 1 university (including its affiliates). Some universities may further limit the number of programs you can apply to.
- Both cases **rank your choices** even though universities say they do not consider rankings
- **Non refundable** application fees- How to Pay?
- They will **ONLY process** your app. once you pay



OCAS/OUAC Application

- Always print off your application once you apply and keep reference number **CONFIDENTIAL**
- You will receive your unique **OUAC Reference Number** when you submit your application. Whenever you contact the OUAC or Ontario universities you must know this.
- Confirmation **e-mails** sent immediately
- For changes for university or college
- **E-mails sent to verify your grades**
- When you can expect a response
- EARLY OFFERS take out of your vocabulary
- **Offers are conditional**
- **Alternate Offers-** college and university
